SPONSOR A SHEPHER PROGRAM

Long before the outside world was aware of the Palanca Negra Gigante, local people living in the same forest as these giant sables, appointed shepherds from their community to watch over the animals they held sacred. Today, Africa's last discovered large mammal and Angola's national symbol, the Palanca Negra Gigante, is threatened by poachers and woodcutters, forces too strong for the shepherds who even during the years of civil war, clung to their calling to protect the majestic sables.

In 2004, Pedro Vaz Pinto, Environmental Advisor to the Catholic University Centre for Scientific Studies and Research, identified that the Palanca Negra Gigante still exist and started giving assistance to the shepherds – radios, proper footwear and uniforms, and a small salary. But in January 2005, his funding (mainly from UNDP) for the Shepherd Program will run out.

Now on the endangered species list, the Palanca Negra Gigante needs help more than ever before. **YOU** can contribute to saving the sable by participating in the "Sponsor a Shepherd" program. Your donation will help pay the shepherd's salary of one hundred dollars per month. In return you will be given a sponsorship certificate that includes a recent photo of the palanca negra, plus a photo of the team of shepherds and a decal to stick on your car, and a monthly update.
